Home, home.

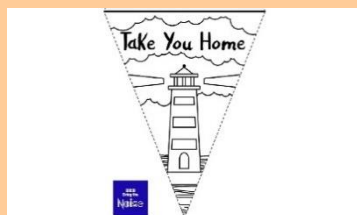
All around the world, hear the clashing of the drums,
