 We've seen it in the bay.

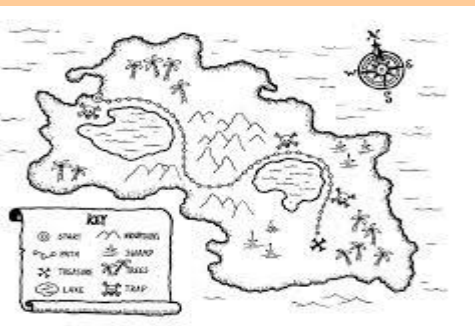
*A skull and crossbones on the mast,
