The school's estimated Early Years Pupil Premium Funding in 2024/2025 is £5130. This additional funding, £342 per pupil, is to be used to make a difference to identified children's progress and the quality of the provision for disadvantaged 3 and 4 year olds.

Therefore, we reserve the right to allocate the pupil premium funding to support any pupil the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.

Pupil Premium funding is used to provide many support systems and interventions. These fall into the following categories: -
