

## EYFS Pupil Premium Funding 2023/2024

**Estimated Funding: £4,788**

**Eligible Pupils: 14**

The school's estimated Early Years Pupil Premium Funding in 2023/2024 is £4,788. This additional funding, £342 per pupil, is to be used to make a difference to identified children's progress and the quality of the provision for disadvantaged 3 and 4 year olds.

"All children, irrespective of ethnicity, culture or religion, home language, family background, learning difficulties or disabilities, gender or ability should have the opportunity to experience a challenging and enjoyable programme of learning and development".

*EYFS Statutory Framework*

In making provision for pupil premium children, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged. We also recognised that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered for, or qualify for free school meals. Therefore, we reserve the right to allocate the pupil premium funding to support any pupil the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.

Pupil Premium funding is used to provide many support systems and interventions. These fall into the following categories: -

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assessing and addressing learning needs via enhanced EAL provision for identified pupils:</li> </ul>	Improved language and communication skills. Additional bilingual EAL support in the Early Years, to improve communication with parents and pupils who do not speak English.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assessing and addressing social need:</li> </ul>	Improved parental involvement and understanding through, for example, the provision of story bags and stay and play sessions.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Providing an enriching environment and resources to support and encourage learning:</li> </ul>	Improved pupil motivation and engagement.
